Soft Skills...Why Are They Important?

Employers view "soft" skills as even more important to work readiness than the 3 "R's." Did you know that 80% of those fired from their jobs are not let go for alack of technical job kills, but for problems with professional conduct, the inability to get along with co-workers, dishonesty, or lack of results-oriented behavior. (American Management Association, COEBE 2011).

Vital soft skills often lacking in new hires:

- Oral and written communication
- Professionalism or work ethic
- Teamwork and collaboration skills
- Critical thinking or problem-solving skills
